Mary Lee's House is Hillsborough County's first and only Child Advocacy and Protection Center. Before Mary Lee's House, key investigative medical, legal, and mental health providers for children who were abused or neglected were spread throughout all of Hillsborough County. In 2002, the planning for a child advocacy and protection center in our community began with the collaboration of child welfare system stakeholders and community partners.

Representatives from the USF Child Protection Team, Children's Advocacy Center, Corbett Trauma Center, and Health Start Coalition of Hillsborough County came together to develop a way to co-locate specialists and work together. In October of 2008, Mary Lee's House opened its doors to the children of Hillsborough County. It is a community collaboration of governmental entities, private donors and public agencies, brought together to provide the best protection for the children of our community all "under one-roof".

Mary Lee's House has 2,500 children pass through our doors every year to receive support and services from our collaboration agencies. It is through this unique structure that we are able to better serve the children, educate the public and prevent abuse in our community. Our space is welcoming and trauma informed to create a safe environment for every child that comes into our house.

Intern Description:

As an intern for Mary Lee's House, you will become a part of the Mary Lee's House (MLH) team. An Intern for MLH will be ready and excited to complete a wide variety and multiple tasks that may assist the team. This can range from:

- Front desk duties of answering phones and greeting clients
- Organization of items in the resource closets; clothing, toy, diaper, book, etc. •
- Assisting clients with selecting needs from the closets
- Social media
- Helping with community outreach and awareness events
- Assisting with fundraising events.

This is an unpaid position, but can be used for class credit if approved by your university. Please note, this internship is not for someone looking for clinical hours, but someone who wants to learn more about the nonprofit sector, the child welfare sector, and what it is like to work with a nonprofit organization.

Intern Requirements:

- Mary Lee's House is open from 8:30- 4:30pm Monday thru Thursday and 8:30- 3:00 on Fridays. Some after hours opportunities will be available for events.
- Must be able to work a minimum of 15 hours per week
- Must be available to the entire semester: Spring (January - end April) Summer (May end of July) Fall (August- Winter Break)
- Must complete and clear level two background check -(no cost to intern)
